Welcome:

PDG. Ashok Panjwani welcomed all and informed that Mrs S.R.Shroff had regretted her inability to attend due to other engagements.

Self introduction:

Members introduced themselves.

Action Taken:

PDG. Panjwani informed that minutes of second meeting held on November 19, 2010 were circulated. The minutes were approved. He briefly reviewed the actions taken from November 19, 2010 till March 18, 2011.

He informed that application to A.I.C.T.E. has been submitted before February 28, 2011. The four courses will be offered. These are

B.E. (Chemical Engg)

60 seats

B.E. (Mechanical Engg)

60 seats

B.E. (Environmental Science & Technology)

60 seats

B.E. (Chemical Technology)

120 students*

* Four specializations namely- i) Dyes & Pigments, ii) Glass & Ceramics, iii) Pharmaceuticals and iv) Polymers & Rubber

He further informed that all the relevant papers to GTU and DTE were also submitted.

PDG Panjwani informed about the donations actually received and the promised ones. He also added that Bank of Baroda have released Rs 1 crore from sanctioned loan.

He informed about the progress made in the construction of college building. Bar chart is made and followed.

Mr Ashwin Modi informed that extra labour was employed and they work in two shifts if necessary so that all the pertinent work can be completed by April 30. 2011. Dr P.V.Krisna suggested that removal of debris as well as leveling and beautification of open space should be planned now. He

further added that present location of canteen may disturb the classes. A plan may be drawn In future to put this place for alternate use and shift the canteen close to workshop.

Progress on AICTE / GTU; Syllabus and Recruitment

AICTE / GTU: Professor Kale informed that the form to AICTE was submitted before Feb 28, 2011, along with the prescribed fees. (Now AICTE has extended the date to March 31, 2011.) The copy of the application and relevant papers regarding land, construction plan and Bank statement etc. with necessary fees has been submitted to GTU and also to DTE. He further informed that application to GTU for the affiliation has also been submitted.

Syllabus: Professor Kale informed that the syllabus followed by GTU for B.E. (Chemical Engg.) and B.E. (Mechanical Engg.) will be followed by the college. The remaining two courses are not offered by GTU and syllabus needs to be prepared. Syllabus is prepared and syllabus committees for each of the two courses namely B.E. (Environmental Science & Technology) and B.E. (Chemical Technology) are being formed. This syllabus will be endorsed by a committee formed by GTU after the letter of approval is issued by GTU.

Recruitment: Professor Kale informed that Mr. Dharmesh Patel has been appointed as Senior Administrative Officer. He further added that advertisement was published in the National and local

News Papers for the post of Principal, teaching faculty needed for first year. The response appears to be good. For the post of Principal there are 8 applications. The position for the remaining positions was as follows: Chemistry (28), Physics (10), Mathematics (6), Mechanical Engineering (2), Civil Engg. (1) while for electrical engineering no application was received. There were 28 applications with B.E. degree only for different branches. For librarian's post there were 14 applications. Efforts are being made to appoint Principal very soon.

Mr. Udas expressed his concern about the possible restrictions on the syllabus. Professor Shukla explained that syllabus prepared by GTU has sufficient freedom and it is industry oriented. He further mentioned that there was sufficient freedom on the internal evaluation. Professor Kale added that syllabus needs to be covered properly by the teacher. A plan is drawn to invite eminent persons from industry and other Institutions to give extra lectures to the students. He further mentioned that the workshop facility will be used to fabricate some equipments and that it would offer an opportunity to the students to witness the design and fabrication processes. The student would be encouraged to design and fabricate and learn the practical aspects. He also mentioned that incubation centers as well as centers of excellence are being planned which would yield additional exposure of students to the contemporary topics. Mr. Udas has offered his help in preparing the syllabus which was appreciated by all.

Dr Rathi suggested offering extra courses like in summer schools. He also stressed the need for excellent results of first year from very beginning. Professor Shukla informed that students may like to enjoy the short vacation they get in first two years. In the summer vacation after the 3rd year, students have to go for industrial training.

Professor Mahajani stressed the need for excellent faculty. Shri. Vinod Rathi suggested using the job portal for getting good faculty. He offered his help in this respect. Shri Pradeep Gohil pointed out the need for the English Language Laboratory. Professor Kale informed that provision for this is already made and that students may be encouraged to learn languages also.

Essay Competition:

Shri A.H.Shukla informed that essay completion for the children from schools (Std. 10, 11 and 12) across Gujarat and part of Maharashtra was organized. The topic was 'Imagine life without chemicals'. It received good response. The brochures were distributed to about 15,000 students through Rotarians and about 3500 Principals of Schools. Total 93 entries were received: 60 in Gujarati, 30 in English and 3 in Hindi. The referees for this are being appointed. The last date is 31st March 23, 2011.

Financial Position:

Shri. Kishor Surti informed that members about the funds received and expenditure actually incurred. He also informed about the future expected expenditure. Professor Mahajani expressed need to provide more funds for the library. Professor Kale informed that initially at least 5000 books and some journals will be procured as per the norms of AICTE.

Professor Shukla informed about the procedure in deciding the fees. The Fees Committee of technical programs decides the fee structure. Initially they may suggest the fees around 35,000 to 40,000. He also added that Government may allow collecting additional fees up to Rs 50,000 per year depending upon the actual expenditure likely to be incurred and the actual expenditure.

Open House:

Professor Mahajani suggested installing fire fighting facilities and lightning arrestors. He also suggested having good security system for which retired army personnel could be considered. He also recommended considering the monitoring of time spent by different staff on the campus.

Shri. Sunil Parekh suggested involving Principals of surrounding schools for promotion of college. He recommended that one or two of them can be part of Technical committee or Governing council. He also stressed the necessity of good faculty. PDG Panjwani informed that pay scale as per 6th pay commission would be implemented and that higher salary would be considered for deserving faculty. He also informed that faculty members would be encouraged for technical consultancy.

Professor Shukla informed that the fraction of HSSC and CBSE students is decided for the entire Gujarat state depending upon number of students appearing and passing these examinations. PDG. Panjwani informed that admission procedure will be laid down by central admissions committee for professional courses.

PDG Panjwani informed that inauguration of college will be done at the hands of Shri. Kalyan Banerjee, the International President of Rotary. Suggestions were made to invite Shri. Narendra Modi, the Chief Minister of Gujarat State, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the past President of India and Mr. Ramesh Jayraman, Central Environmental Minister.

Professor Mahajani suggested that a good Guest House may be provided for Visiting Faculty.

Dr. Sriram suggested including more tutorials for the first two semesters which may help to raise the standard of students.

Members expressed the satisfaction over the progress made. The efforts put in by Shri Dharmesh Patel, Shri. Pratik Tailor, Shri. Manoj Patel, Shri. Kalpesh Bhagat and support provided by Shri. B.D. Dalwadi and Dr. Parmeswaran was appreciated by all.


Discussion on bringing in discipline from industry right from the day one


Prof. Shrikant Wagh and Prof. D D Kale presented various ways for bringing discipline at SRICT. The members suggested some more ways for the same.
